1. Am I eligible to submit an application in this grant ground?

2. About the Children's Hospital Foundation

The Children's Hospital Foundation is the charity of the Queensland Children's Hospital, the Centre for Children's Health Research, and for all sick kids throughout Queensland. We work wonders for sick kids by funding life-saving medical research, investing in vital new equipment, and providing comfort, entertainment, family support and care programs for sick kids. Our vision is for every child to have the best possible health care, with access to world-class research and clinical treatment in a healing environment. Our mission is to improve children's health by supporting and funding world-class research and clinical treatment, and by providing care and entertainment for children and their families.

3. About the Working Wonders Grant Scheme

The Children's Hospital Foundation has developed the Working Wonders Grant Scheme to facilitate equitable access to funding to improve health outcomes for children throughout Queensland. In this scheme, funding can be requested for:

- educational programs or resources;
- support services or materials for patients and families;
- projects or programs with no research component;
- salary for clinical support staff who provide a critical service within a health service caring for children, but who cannot be funded by the existing department budget;
- equipment and distraction resources

Activities and equipment for which funds are requested should **augment the standard of care** provided by health services and must not be covered by a department's existing budget.

Funding requests should align with the mission and vision of the Children's Hospital Foundation by aiming to improve child and adolescent health care and medical services and enhance the support provided to patients and their families.

In the 2019-2020 Working Wonders Grant Round, the Children's Hospital Foundation has up to **\$1.5 million available for allocation**. This is the total funding available to CHQ **and** other Queensland-based health services caring for children and adolescents.

3.1 Value of the Award

The following limits apply to funding requests in the Working Wonders Grant Scheme:

Category	Maximum Funding Available Per Grant	Maximum Funding Period Per Grant
Development and implementation of educational programs or resources for patients and families	Up to \$100,000	One year
Development and implementation of educational programs or resources for health care professionals	Up to \$100,000	One year
Development and implementation of support services for patients and families	Up to \$100,000	One year
Creation of support materials or packages for patients and families	Up to \$50,000	One year
Conduct of clinical projects or programs with no research component that support children and their families	Up to \$100,000	Two years
Salary for clinical support staff who provide a critical service within a health service caring for children, but who cannot be funded by the existing department budget (i.e. activity code does not exist)	Up to \$100,000 per annum	Two years
Equipment	No limit	Six months

Applicants who are able to provide a strong justification with supporting evidence and a detailed budget, may request more funding than the limits defined above.



3.2 Assessment Process

All applications require approval from the local health service Chief Executive / Director and the CEO of the affiliated hospital foundation (if applicable) prior to submission, as evidenced by a Letter of Support.

Applications submitted in the Working Wonders Grant Round will be screened for eligibility and fundraising potential by the Children's Hospital Foundation.

Applications may be prioritised for funding in consultation with regional health service representatives (including Foundations) and consumers. The following criteria may be considered during the prioritisation process:

- value for money
- suitability for fundraising
- availability of co-funding
- availability of tied funding (e.g through Woolworths Regional Wall Tokens Campaign)
- impact of equipment or activity on children's health or the healthcare delivery provided

To improve the chances of your application being approved for funding, and subsequently securing funding, you should consider your application to be a pitch. Clearly articulate **what** you are seeking funding for and **how** the activity / equipment will achieve a significant **impact on children's health outcomes**.

4. Award, Monitoring and Evaluation

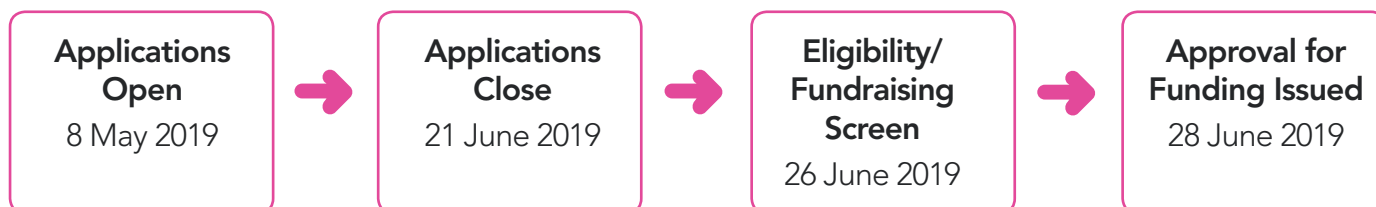
If funds are secured for a Working Wonders Grant, the successful applicant will receive a formal Letter of Offer, and the Terms and Conditions of funding. The Terms and Conditions of funding will describe reporting and acquittal requirements that the grant recipient must comply with for the Children's Hospital Foundation to release funds.

The Terms and Conditions of funding are non-negotiable. Acceptance of Terms and Conditions of funding must be signed by the grant recipient and an authorised representative of the health service. Electronic copies must be returned to the Children's Hospital Foundation within 30 business days or the offer of award may lapse.

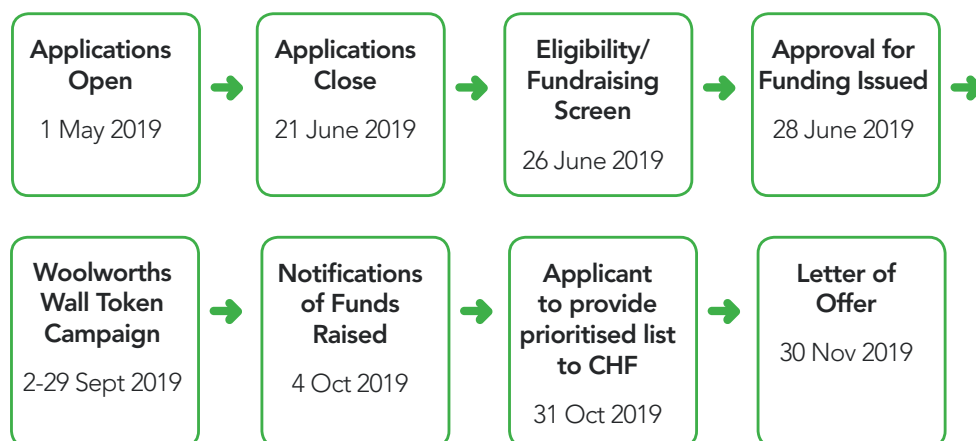

Regional (non-CHQ) Working Wonders Grant Round Timelines

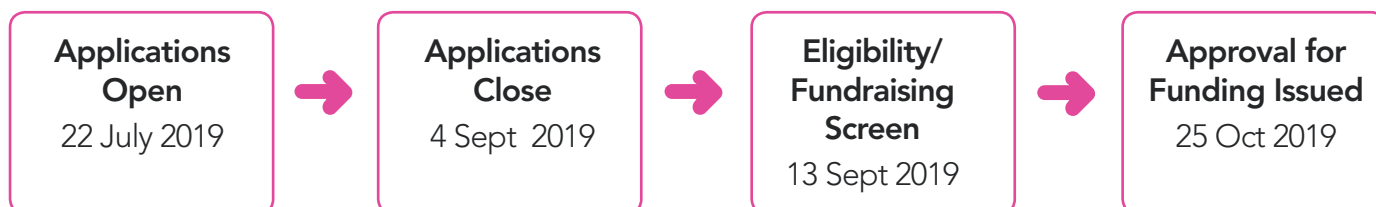
